

How To Get To Puerto Galera

The Do It Yourself Way

Many buses from different companies travel between Metro Manila and Batangas Port. Choose a bus that has these two signs in the front window: “Batangas Pier” and “Calabarzon”, which means via Star Tollway. Some now tout the sign “via ACTEX” or “Non-stop” or “Express” - these are typically faster.

Air-conditioned buses that travel via the South Superhighway (SLEX) and Star Tollway from the following companies are frequent and most provide Wifi Internet aboard: JAM Transit, DLTB, ALPS and Ceres Liner.

Buses to Batangas Pier can be found either, at bus stops along EDSA (starting from Cubao) or, at the corner of Taft Avenue and Sen. Gil J. Puyat Avenue (Buendia) in Pasay City (leaving every hour or more frequently). Some of the Ceres Liner buses (corner Taft Avenue and Sen, Gil Puyat Avenue), now feature on-board toilets!

Under normal circumstances you should allow two-and-a-half hours bus travel time from Metro Manila to Batangas. The fare is around Php400 per person (it varies depending on bus line). Note: Bus operators use the first-come-first-served method of seat allocation; there is no advance booking.

Currently the first scheduled ferry trip from Batangas to Balatero Port (Puerto Galera's main port) is at 07:00hrs. (7.00am) -- fare around Php700 per person (less on the Ro-Ro); last scheduled ferry trip to Balatero Port is around 14:00 hrs. (2.00pm), except on Friday, Saturday and Sunday when they may offer later ferries during peak-season.

Other charges: Batangas Port Terminal Fee is Php30 per person and the Puerto Galera EUF is Php120 per person at arrival. If you miss the last ferry then you will need to find accommodation in the Batangas City. Due to changes in maritime regulations (1st July, 2018) there are no current sailings direct to Sabang or White Beach – everything goes through Balatero Port.

Arriving at Balatero Port, look for a tricycle to take you to Muelle Pier (less than 10 minutes away) where you have a choice of the PGYC dinghy service to the PGYC Pier or you can take a leisurely walk along the new Mangrove Walk, starting beside the replica Galleon sailing ship, to witness some unusual features of Mother Nature. The yacht club will be happy to serve hot and ice-cold beverages and a selection of meals or snacks upon arrival. Alternatively, you could go direct to your resort and then join us later.

What is the “EUF”? The EUF is the Environmental Usage Fee charged by municipal authorities, governing tourist destinations around the Philippines. The EUF may vary depending on the destination. The current EUF for Tourists entering Puerto Galera is Php120 per person. This is a one-time fee payable upon arrival at Balatero Pier.
